

Tolerance of those of different Faiths and Beliefs

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This is achieved through enhancing pupils understanding of their place in a culturally diverse society and by giving them opportunities to experience such diversity. At Edwalton Primary and School we teach the children to be tolerant and respectful. We represent a rich and varied community of over 19 nationalities and languages; we are a multi-faith school and the children are encouraged to share and celebrate their uniqueness. Throughout the school the children learn about world faiths and celebrate many different religious festivals often using their own experience and knowledge to inform others. Assemblies and discussions involving prejudices and prejudice-based bullying have been followed and supported by learning in RE and PSHE. We have visitors from a variety of faiths and backgrounds.
